**SUBJECT:** Notice of Changes to Wood Packaging Material (WPM) Violation Threshold – Effective November 1, 2017

**REFERENCES:** Cargo Systems Messaging Service #17-000609 – Issuance of Wood Packaging Material Penalty - September 25, 2017

The purpose of this Trade Notice is to remind the trade community of changes to the WPM violation threshold which becomes effective November 1, 2017.

**BACKGROUND:**


In 2005, the United States began enforcement of the International Standards for Phytosanitary Measures - 15, requiring fumigation or heat treatment of all WPM and its corresponding treatment stamp. United States Department of Agriculture regulations requiring the treatment of WPM are found in 7 C.F.R. § 319.40-3 and are intended to protect U.S. agricultural resources from the introduction of potentially injurious wood boring pests. Penalties and/or liquidated damages are assessed when a company fails to comply with these regulations.

**PROCEDURES:**

Effective November 1, 2017, trade entities with a documented WPM violation can now be issued a penalty with each violative event. There is no longer a five violation threshold and the yearly resetting of the violation count has been discontinued. The ports of entry will have full discretion on the issuing of penalties.
